

THE PTGPFI 2017 SONATINA-SONATA COMPETITION

1. Rationale

This competition aims to revisit and refamiliarize the usual sonatinas and sonatas of the great composers including the performance and pedagogical practice as well as to explore these types of works from other equally great composers including those written by Filipinos.

2. Eligibility and Age Categories

The cut-off date for age eligibility shall be 01 February 2017.

- Category A1: 9 yrs. old and below.
- Category A2: 10–12 yrs. old but will not reach 13.
- Category B1: 13–16 yrs. old but will not reach 17.
- Category B2: 17–20 yrs. old but will not reach 21.
- Category C: 21–30 yrs old but will not reach 31.

3. Competition Rounds (Updated)

The venue shall be Founders' Hall & Levesville Hall in St. Paul University Manila.

4. Application and Registration

- 4.1. The following documents must be submitted through personal delivery or courier service in a short brown envelope:
 - a. Application Form completely accomplished in duplicate. This may be downloaded from the files section of www.pianoteachers.org.ph or through the Facebook page https://www.facebook.com/groups/115160245174265/files/. For those who have no access to the internet, the Application Form may be requested through any of the Competition Committee Members.
 - b. For Filipino citizens, one photocopy of applicant's NSO birth certificate or passport details. For foreign nationals residing in the Philippines, one photocopy of passport AND either current school registration form or ACR that will indicate a stay of at least six (6) months prior to 01 February 2017.
 - c. Two copies of recent colored ID (2 \times 2) with applicant's name printed at the back of each photo.
 - d. Three ringbound copies of the music score chosen by the applicant, preferably without any markings. *Applicant's name must not appear in any of the music pages or risk of being disqualified from the competition.*
- 4.2. The non-refundable registration fee shall be as follows:
 - ONE THOUSAND PESOS (P1000.00) for applicants whose teacher/coach is a PTGPFI member.
 - ONE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED PESOS (P1500.00) for applicants whose teacher/coach is a non-PTGPFI member.

All packets shall then be turned over to the Competition Committee for preliminary processing then, the Competition Chairman (George Ong) shall view these to make sure all requirements are met before handing down his final approval.

5. Repertoire Requirements

5.1. Each category has a designated required work with a suggested list (see separate pages). The first movement shall be performed in the preliminary round while the complete work shall be rendered during the final round.

CATEGORY	REQUIREMENT	
A1	A complete multi-movement sonatina by any classical period composer.	
A2	A complete multi-movement sonatina either from category A1, Romantic period, 20th/21st century, or those written by Filipino composers.	
B 1	A complete multi-movement sonata by Beethoven, Czerny, Haydn, Kuhnau, Mozart, or by a Filipino composer.	
B2	A complete multi-movement sonata by Beethoven, Clementi, Schubert or by a Filipino composer.	
C	A complete sonata either from the Classical period, the Romantic period, 20th/21st century, or those written by Filipino composers.	

- 5.2. Applicants must perform the required work from memory. Applicants that choose higher level works or those that are not in the category suggested list will have to be approved by the Chairman prior to final application submission thus, it is recommended to submit early and avoid any problems.
- 5.3. (Updated) Applicants that choose a sonatina or sonata above their age category must register in the category where their chosen piece is located. However, applicants are allowed to enter in only one category.
- 5.4. Applicants shall be responsible in legally acquiring the scores of pieces that are not yet under public domain as well as secure clearance for performance from copyright owners, among others. PTGPFI shall not be held accountable for any infraction regarding copyright and licenses.
- 5.5. If the application has already been submitted, changes may not be allowed without the written approval of the Competition Chairman. Changes will no longer be entertained after the 13 December 2016 deadline.
- 5.6. In order for a category not to be dissolved, there should be at least 5 applicants whose applications are approved. Consequently, there shall be no refund of the registration fee.
- 5.7. All winners from each category shall perform at the Winners' Concert and Awarding Ceremonies.

Non-compliance or falsification of any of the above-mentioned requirements shall be a sufficient ground for disqualification or forfeiture of a prize. Applicants and their respective teachers should not communicate with any of the jurors until the Final Round is finished. The decision of the jury is final. The Competition Committee reserves the right to change any aspect in the competition (e.g. schedules of competition, venue, etc.) as deemed necessary without prejudice to the contestants.

Note:

- 1. All works in the 20th/21st century composers are most likely still under copyright especially if their works are published after 1923.
- 2. Works may be considered public domain 50 years after the composer's death (assuming s/he is the only author of the work). If there is more than one author, then it shall be 50 years after the death of the last surviving author. This is under Philippine Copyright Law (Republic Act 8293 of January 1998).
- 3. Some recently published compositions may also still be under copyright even if the composer has been dead prior to 1900. This is due to the fact that the publication may have occurred during the middle or late 20th (or even early 21st) century. The music may have been public domain but the actual printed score is still under copyright (e.g. Schubert's Grazer Fantasie was published in 1969 hence, the printed score is still under copyright even though the music is already public domain.)
- 4. For Philippine composers, the best way to contact the composer's heirs/estate is through their family and/or publisher. One possibility is to call through the alumni/HR office of music schools (e.g. UP, UST, St. Paul, St. Scho, CEU) and ask for any available contact information on the composers who may have once been linked to that school either as a teacher or as a graduate. Searching through the internet may also be helpful.
- 5. All works listed here are suggested pieces. If applicants will want to perform a work not listed here, s/he may do so provided it is within a particular classification (e.g. Classical, Romantic, 20th/21st Century, or Filipino) and s/he must first inquire from the Competition Chairman and seek an approval for such request to perform a non-listed work.
